Dear Neighbor,

We are sending this letter as a courtesy to share information on upcoming pipeline construction activity in your area.

The two workspace areas for horizontal directional drill 360, or HDD 360, will be at Shoen Road in West Whiteland Township and Devon Drive in Uwchlan Township. Attached to this letter is a map of the two workspace areas associated with this drill. Energy Transfer's pipeline contractor, Michels, will be installing the Mariner East 2 (20-inch diameter) pipeline between these two workspace areas.

Drill Specifics

- Length of HDD 360 20-inch pipeline: 2,840 ft.
- Duration of 20-inch pipeline installation: Approximately 120 days from start*

*The duration to complete these drills is always subject to change due to weather and other factors.

Site Activity

In the coming days, you will see the Michels construction team mobilize onto the HDD 360 workspace areas and begin to set up equipment that will support their operations. This includes the installation of a steel casing at the sites. The installation of this casing may take up to a week to complete and at times will be noisy.

We have elected to install casing in order to minimize the potential for adverse environmental impacts during construction in this area. After discussions with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) about ways to proactively mitigate the potential for subsidence and inadvertent returns, we determined that installing casing was the appropriate measure in certain geologies. State and federal regulators understand that casing installation is an industry

best practice option. These proactive safety measures are to the benefit of the surrounding environment and communities.

Other equipment brought onto the site will include, but is not limited, to:

- HDD drill rig
- Mud recycling machine
- Mud mixing systems
- Water holding tank
- Vacuum systems
- Power generator

In addition to following all Occupational Safety and Health Administration regulations, we are taking various measures to mitigate noise. These measures include sound walls and source mitigation on and around certain equipment.
